



B02 and B05 attended [APLL 12](#), which would have been in Oslo, Norway this year. Birgit Hellwig (B02) gave the keynote and B05 gave a presentation. Birgit Hellwig commented that "the keynotes were organized as webinars, and so I knew beforehand that I wouldn't be able to see the

audience and that the audience wouldn't be able to talk to me. I felt apprehensive about this format – but I was surprised how well it all went: the host kept her video on, and I essentially gave my presentation to her, taking my cues from her reactions; and the audience made extensive use of the chat function to ask their questions in the end." Sonja Riesberg explained that although "a real-life conference is more fun, and sitting in front of the monitor for three days and listening to presentations is really exhausting, there are also positive sides and perhaps they even outweigh the negatives". How is that?

"We certainly had a bigger audience than we would have had on site, because many colleagues from all over the world registered to listen to us, who did not present a poster of their own, and so would certainly not have travelled to Oslo. In addition, a lot of CO² could be 'saved' because we all stayed at home."

Multilingualism 2021




